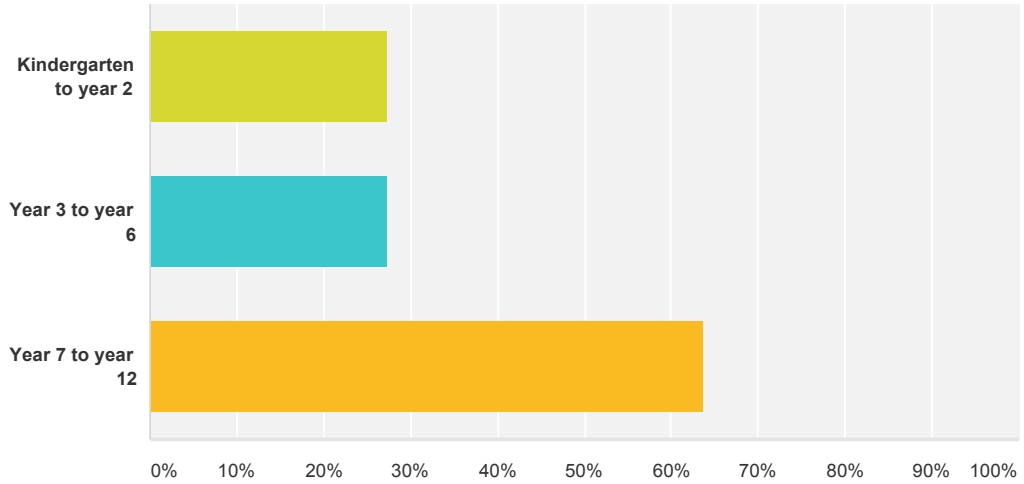

Thank you for the hard work that is undertaken at Southlands by all involved. One very important point we want to make is, please bring back the reading of Gods Word together in the classroom. As we heard this week from our child as we were discussing school and asking questions,- although there is verbal encouragement and great teaching, from the lovely teachers at the school, (and we fully support them and the Principal).. no Bible reading or devotions has taken place in the Year 7/8 form room this term. We don't think this has occurred in other classes either but are not 100% sure of that. We see this as highly important..necessary - a message for all students that God comes first in our school day and from Him can come help and comfort through the lessons and social interactions etc. Students need the encouragement that comes only from hearing and reading the Bible - we are 100% convinced and sure that this commitment and aim, will make a huge and significant difference in their lives and the progress of the school. If we bear the name of Christ as a school, shouldn't it then be made a priority to read some scripture daily to students, or have students themselves read from Gods powerful and life changing Word? There has been a tangible (positive!) change within the school community since Mr Bromhead's arrival at Southlands this year. The teaching staff are excellent and my children enjoy coming to school and are thriving within the school community.

We were pleased when our child came home this week excited that he had played soccer during recess. He has struggled much of the year during recesses with the lack of activity despite encouragement from us to initiate something. I don't know if there is some way for the teachers to continue encouraging sport activities during recess? We have also been very impressed by the increased spiritual tone from the principal and glad to see such strong leadership.

The new news letter was a welcome ray of sunshine from an otherwise seemingly flat school life . The staff are required to have authentic Christian walks and be committed to serving god through attendance at a local church , few do- that is a major issue . Specific requirements that need to be met for my child have not been met . They no longer have decent morning devotions or are encouraged to pray for one another , challenged in their faith or protected there in expressing their faith . I have had my child told by another that he hates Christians and it's all a load of crap !!!
